DCS STAFF UPDATE

Our math teacher is Mrs. Dorcas Art. Mrs. Art graduated from Bob Jones University with a bachelor's degree in math education. FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: TUESDAY, AUGUST 30: We anticipate 280-290 students. All grades begin classes at 8:30 a.m. Dismissal times are as follows: Kindergarten through Sixth - 3:00 p.m. Seventh through Twelfth - 3:10 p.m.

KINDERGARTEN PARENTS: Students with last names beginning with A-P will report to school on Tuesday, August 30 and stay home on Wednesday, August 31. Students with names beginning with R-Z will report to school on Wednesday, August 31 and stay home on Tuesday, August 30. All kindergarten students will report to school on Thursday, September 1.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL – Dress Codes

Just a reminder to parents that dress code is in effect for the first day of school.

- 1. Oxford and Polo shirts must be tucked in at all times, even when wearing a sweater, vest or fleece. All buttons must be fastened with the exception of the top button. Oxford collar buttons must be fastened.
- 2. Seventh-twelfth grade students may wear black school fleeces (purchased from Educational Apparel) during school hours. Fleeces or any other clothing may not be torn, cut or disfigured in any manner. Athletic team sweatshirts (name, number, etc.), any other kind of sweatshirt, or jacket may NOT be worn during the school day. Uniform shirts must be worn <u>under</u> the fleeces.
- 3. Hair must be in compliance the first day of school. Gentlemen's hair must be neatly trimmed above the collar and eyebrows. Half the ear must show. Hair dyeing (unnatural colors) or styles that draw undue attention are not permitted for ladies or gentlemen. Ladies hair must be neatly combed and restrained.
- 4. Seventh-twelfth grade girls are reminded that skirt length needs to be to the top of the knee or longer. Skirts are not permitted to be rolled at the waist.

The school administrator shall have final responsibility on deciding dress code issues. Parents are requested to be the first to see that students are in compliance. Dress code will apply before, during, and after school. Students must go home in the same clothes that they arrive in unless permission has been granted otherwise.

ELEMENTARY STUDENT DRESS CODE REMINDERS

Parents please read and encourage students to adhere to the rules:

- Shoes: Tennis shoes are preferred for the playground. Due to injuries in the classroom and on the playground, flip 1. flops should not be worn to school. If sandals are worn, they should be substantial and cover much of the feet. 2.
 - Shirts under uniform tops should be white only and free of visible slogans or logos.
- 3. Belts are required to be worn with shorts and pants.
- 4. Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- 5. Socks should be plain white, navy, red, or khaki. No stripes or wild patterns are permitted.
- 6. Hair must be in compliance the first day of school. Gentlemen's hair must be neatly trimmed above the collar and eyebrows. Half the ear must show. Hair dyeing (unnatural colors) or styles that draw undue attention are not permitted for ladies or gentlemen.

STUDENT PICKUP AND DROP OFF

Pick up will be east of the gym door on the south side of the south parking lot. Drop off will be at the Connector. The east gym doors will not be open in the morning. The front doors of the church will not be open at any time. Do not block the driveway. If you must leave your car or wait any length of time, please pull into a parking space in either the east or Ponderosa lot to help traffic flow.

SCHOOL FEES

\$120 per family for facility fee and \$250 per student for book fees are due by July 29. Tuition payments are due the 10th of each month from August through May. If you would like a monthly tuition invoice, please contact the school office. We e-mail all statements. Please be sure that we have your correct e-mail address. A finance charge of 1.0% is assessed at the end of each month for any overdue amount.

NEW STUDENT REFERALS

This is a reminder to all school families. If you refer any new students to our school and the parents schedule and complete an interview, the school family will receive \$150 toward their tuition account. If the referral family enrolls their student, the school family will receive an additional \$150 toward their account. This is a quick and easy way to reduce your tuition bill and help the school also.

REMINDER OF IMMUNIZATION LAWS

It is a state law that we have a record of immunizations before your child can start kindergarten. Please send this information with your child the first day of school if we do not already have it. All students in kindergarten through twelfth grade must have evidence of receiving two doses of MMR vaccine. All students in kindergarten though seventh grade are required to have three doses of hepatitis B vaccine. If parents have a good cause/religious objection, a letter, signed by the parent, stating the objection must be on file in the school immunization records. Delaware County Health Department gives immunizations at a reduced price. You can call them for times and dates, (740) 368-1700.
