## DO YOU HAVE INTERNET ACCESS?

School communication to parents is managed primarily through the school's web site, www.dcschool.org, and Edline. Items such as the school newsletters, elementary teachers' newsletter, midterms, sports schedules, and report cards are posted to one of these sites. Parents are strongly encouraged to contact these sites to keep up to date. **If you do not have internet at home and require a hard copy of office items, contact the school office by Friday, September 6.** Last year's families will not automatically be listed for this year.

#### OPEN HOUSE

This year's Open House is scheduled for Thursday, August 29, at 7:00 p.m. We will meet in the sanctuary to begin and then be dismissed to visit in your child's room. The bell will ring every 10 minutes to give parents opportunity to visit all classrooms of their students. This is a time for teachers to go over their class requirements. Secondary schedules will be available for parents at the table in the foyer. Please leave your children at home. This is an adult only event.

# **REPORTING ABSENCES**

Please do so by phone, voice mail, or e-mail before 9:00 a.m. daily. Please state a reason for the absence.

# STUDENT DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

The same traffic pattern will be used as last year. Students should be dropped off and picked up in front of the connector doors during the school day. Elementary students should be picked up at the south parking area at the end of the school day. If you are parking, stay to the left and find a parking spot. <u>Student drivers</u> are asked to park in the former Ponderosa parking lot. This will relieve traffic congestion for parents bringing students. **DO NOT USE THE FRONT CHURCH DOORS.** 

# **MORNING PROCEDURE**

There are staff devotions every morning from 8:00 - 8:20. There will be a teacher on duty every morning starting at 8:00 a.m. Elementary students should gather in the gym. Seventh through ninth grade students should gather in the concession stand area or the hallway by the lockers. Eleventh and twelfth grade students should gather in the lobby and hall areas by the library. At the conclusion of staff devotions, the students will be dismissed to their homerooms.

All students (K-12) who are tardy must come to the office to receive a pass to enter their homerooms. Students are tardy if they are not <u>in their rooms</u> by the second bell at 8:30 a.m.

# EDLINE ACCOUNTS

Activation codes were sent home in this week's folders for new students/parents. Students in grades 7-12 will receive their own activation codes in addition to the family code. Returning parents will receive their activation codes if they did not activate their Edline account last school year. If you are a returning school family and have not activated your account you are encouraged to do so.

# TRANSPORTATION REIMBURSEMENT

Parents need to be aware they can qualify for transportation reimbursement from their home district. This payment is close to \$180.00 per student. The school sends a listing to each district of the students who attend DCS. Most of the larger, local school districts will use this listing to send a Pay-in-Lieu of transportation form. This form must be signed and returned by the specified date to receive this benefit. However, other districts require the parent to contact them directly and request the allotted funds. Who qualifies? The drive must be within 30 minutes from the school district's driveway to our school's driveway. The school district has the option to provide transportation or payment. If you move, you must notify the school office and affected district(s) of your address change. It is the parent's responsibility to contact their school district to receive these funds. Delaware City Schools – They will work off the list we send them and will mail a form to you. Olentangy Schools – A form from our office will be sent to you to fill out and return to Olentangy Schools. Buckeye Valley Schools – A form has been filled out and sent to B.V. school district for you. Other School Districts – Call your local school district to request the allotted funds.

#### BOOK COVERS ~ DO'S AND DON'TS

All text books <u>MUST</u> be covered. <u>PLEASE</u> do not use the sticky contact paper covers or "book socks" that are available. At the end of the school year when books are turned in, if books are found to have been covered with sticky book covers, the student will be charged for the cost of the book – that amounts to \$50 to \$75 depending on the text book. So please – take care of your books!!

# LUNCH PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Senate Bill 210 went into effect July 1, 2011. This bill restricts food and beverage sales for all schools in the State of Ohio. The rules apply during school hours. What does it mean to Delaware Christian School? Foods of minimal nutrition value (soda, snack cakes, candy, chips (Cheetos, Fritos, etc.) cannot be sold. Available for purchase will be snacks like NutriGrain Cereal & Yogurt Bars, Kashi TLC Bars, Quaker Snack Mix Kids' Mix, pretzels and baked chips. We have endeavored to serve a healthier entrée as well.
